Situated at the very tip of the Manhood Peninsula, families will love the old-fashioned charm of Selsey, with its busy High Street, home to a variety of excellent shops including local butchers, greengrocers and bakers as well as shops selling perennial holiday favourites such as traditional sweets and rock, buckets and spades, and of course the all-important crabbing gear. You can pick up some supplies and then head for nearby East Beach where you can try your luck crabbing, before picking up fresh-caught fish from the many small fishermans' huts at the nearby working fishing beach.

Watersports junkies are spoilt for choice, with Kayaking and outstanding Scuba Diving and snorkelling right off the beach in Selsey.

Nature-lovers will find it hard to decide where to divide their time. The vast network of creeks, rifes and channels that mark the area are home to a huge variety of wading birds and wildfowl; Redshank and Ringed Plover, Oystercatchers and Goldeneye are all common sights in this internationally important area. In the winter the area is home to thousands of over-wintering Black-Bellied Brent Geese, all unable to resist the rich and varied habitat.

The nearby RSPB reserve at Pagham Harbour is endowed with a huge variety of bird life. Summer visitors are regularly treated to sightings of the iconic Avocet on Ferry Pool, whilst flocks of Lapwing

land on the surrounding fields. Lucky visitors may occasionally spot a stray Osprey fishing in the Harbour at high tide, whilst Little Egrets are

frequently seen in the many channels. In the winter the Harbour is alive to the sound of flocks of overwintering Geese who come to graze in the surrounding fields.

Seals are often seen in the area, fishing for easy pickings in the narrow harbour inlet on the change of the tide at Pagham Harbour, looking for scraps from the fishing boats at Selsey East Beach, or basking on the sandy beaches around the back of East Head. To the West of Selsey, the newly created harbour at Medmerry promises to make the area un-missable for all nature-lovers. Located between Selsey and Bracklesham Bay,the area was deliberately flooded in September 2013 to create one of the largest new wetland areas ever





surrendered to the sea in the UK.

Surrounded by a network of cycle paths, footpaths and bridleways this area offers unparalleled access to the unique wildlife and habitats of the area. Selsey visitors can hire bicycles in the town and then ride to Chichester via the largely off-road Bill Way, or families can easily access the new routes around Medmerry, with over 7kms of unspoilt cycle paths, miles from the nearest roads and face to face with the wildlife.

The fishing beaches at Selsey are famous internationally for their crab and lobster as well as fish such as bass, bream and skate and the town is full of good cafes and restaurants where you can buy the local catch of the day, or enjoy quality local produce from the fertile fields of the coastal plain.

History abounds in the area and many visitors are tempted to waste hours at Church Norton just a mile north of Selsey looking for remains of a legendary Cathedral which local myth claims was lost to the sea and prompting the re-location of the bishopric to Chichester. Submerged Cathedral or not, Church Norton is a beautiful unspoilt spot to sit and watch the

world go by.

There are always plenty of events going on in Selsey; Selsey Fireworks, which takes place in

October, and is one of the biggest displays on the South Coast, whilst Christmas sees a flurry of special events, late night-

Selsev Lights display for visitors.





Selsey Lifeboat



In 1958 the RNLI decided to build a new boathouse and slip way at a cost of over £75,000. The 110 metre gangway was built using steel and timber decking and the boathouse was reinforced concrete with a steel slipway on concrete piles. The boathouse became operational in April 1960 and was officially opened by the Duke of Richmond and Gordon in July that year. During the 57years three different classes of lifeboats have operated from the boathouse,

RNLB Canadian Pacific 46ft Watson class 1938-1969, RNLB Charles Henry 48ft 6in Oakley class 1969-1983, RNLB City of London 47ft Tyne class 1983-2006, RNLB Voluntary Worker 47ft Tyne class 2006-2017. During that time several other lifeboats have

launched from the station whilst on relief duties. Since 1960 Selsey lifeboats have launched from the current boathouse 972 times and assisted in excess of 850 people.

Sometimes in recent years the launch has been delayed by divers exploring the sea life underneath the boathouse. On the 26th August 2013 an unexploded 500lb bomb was discovered 100 metres from the boathouse and the lifeboat was launched as a precaution while the bomb was dealt with by the Royal Navy explosive ordnance disposal team.



There have been several film and TV crews over the years filming adverts such as Timex watches in the 60's, Fisherman's Friends and Lacoste clothes in the 80's and 90's, Shirley Bassey launched on the Charles Henry while singing for her Saturday night show in 1976. Rory McGrath filmed for the Discovery channel and Guy Ritchie filmed the splash as the Tyne launched to be used in the Sherlock Holmes film in 2008. The Birdman rally started at Selsey launching from the lifeboat gangway in the early 70's before moving to Bognor.

The current boathouse has been replaced by a new building which will house both the inshore lifeboat and the new Shannon class lifeboat which has been allocated to Selsey

to replace the Tyne class. The Shannon class is designed to be launched from the beach by a state of the art launch and recovery rig. Both the Shannon lifeboat and launching rig are due to arrive at station later this year so after Voluntary Worker launches on the 1st April it will be moored off Selsey and still be the operational lifeboat until such time as the Shannon becomes the station lifeboat.

RNLI Selsey Lifeboat Station

The decision in early 2012 by the Operations Committee of the RNLI to place a new Shannon Class All Weather Lifeboat at Selsey secures the future of an RNLI Lifeboat Station at Selsey for the next fifty years.

This heralds the biggest change in lifeboating, as we have known it, since Selsey Lifeboat Station was established 153 years ago in 1861.

The Shannon Class was designed entirely in house by RNLI naval architects and harnesses cutting edge technology to ensure the new lifeboat class meets the requirements of a 21st century rescue service.

For almost 50 years all all weather lifeboat classes have been named after rivers and this is no exception. It is the first time an Irish river name has been used and this reflects the RNLI coverage of the entire coast of the UK and Ireland.

The introduction of the Shannon into the RNLI's fleet will be the final step in enabling the RNLI to fulfil it's commitment that all operational all weather lifeboats will have a top speed of 25 knots. At around 30% faster than our existing Tyne Class the Shannon will enable our volunteer crew to provide assistance to casualties much faster.

The Shannon Class will be the first allweather lifeboat to be powered by twin water jets, making it more manoeuvrable and safer to operate in shallow



waters - particularly

relevant to the waters around Selsey - while reducing the risk of damage during launch and recovery.

The Shannon is 13 metres long, about the same as our current Tyne Class, with a range of one hundred nautical miles or ten hours duration. She is inherently self righting in the unlikely event of a capsize returning to an upright position, like all RNLI all weather lifeboats.

The Shannon incorporates the latest SIMS (systems and information management system), will be launched from a specially designed tractor borne carriage and recovered bow first either afloat or beached if weather conditions require.

A purpose built shore facility to house the Shannon is required. This will incorporate all our existing facilities, an ALB boat hall, ILB boathouse, Selsey Lifeboat Station history, a souvenir shop, plus specialist training facilities, crew room, showers workshop and an office.

The first Shannon class lifeboat is already operational at Dungeness Lifeboat Station and our Shannon is currently expected to be on station in Selsey in 2017.

Beaches are a place of joy and fun most of the year provided a few precautions are taken by all who use them.

Man-made hazards:

including piers, groynes, breakwaters, jetties, and sea defences etc

- and do not jump or dive off them.
- Take great caution when walking on wet or uneven surfaces, and look out for sharp objects.



The beach fisherman is fortunate in being able to choose between two entirely different beaches

The West Beach is a relatively calm and sandy beach which favours us with the flat fish family, flounder, dab, sole, plaice, thornback and stingray. Other species often caught are silver eel, bass, dogfish and occasionally tope. Bait for these species are ragworm, squid, limpets, hermit crabs, razor fish, sand eels and mackerel.

The East Beach, with its steeply shelving shingle extending from the Bill right along to the end of the sea wall at Park Lane, is not so productive as West Beach with regard to the variety of species which can be caught, but those that are caught here, namely cod, bass, sole and flounder can be very good specimens.

The Chichester Canal is renowned for its coarse fishing. Carp are plentiful and there are good stocks of roach, rudd, perch, bream and tench, as well as some monster pike. There are also a few chubb and dace.

There is a pleasant four mile walk along the towpath of the canal and it's banks are a haven for wildlife of particular interest to ornithologists.

Day, weekly and season tickets can be purchased at Raycrafts or from the bailiffs. For further details, please see the notices at the Basin and Hunston Car Park or for more information call into Raycrafts in Selsey High Street.





The Belsey Bhuttle

The bus, now known as the "Selsey Shuttle" was first seen on the streets of Selsey back in 1996. It had been the brainchild of a small group of members of the congregation of St. Peter's Church who had become aware of how difficult it was to get around the town if you

didn't own a car or live near a "Stagecoach" bus stop. Hence the seed was sown for a local public bus service in Selsey to supplement the "Stagecoach" service which, because of the size of the company's vehicles, was limited to Selsey's main roads.

The first bus which, as many people remember, was a bright red Mercedes-Benz, was much loved by those who travelled in it. It served the town faithfully for 13 years until 2009, when maintenance and repairs were becoming too expensive.

The present bus was essentially provided through a new arrangement set up by the Government at the end of 2014, the Community Minibus Fund. This bus also has additional features financed by a grant from the Selsey Southern Co-operative store's community fund.

All members of the public are eligible to ride on the bus, it is not part of a club and if you have a bus pass, you can ride for free after 9.30 a.m.(although a contribution towards our running costs is always much appreciated). Unfortunately, however, the bus is not designed to accommodate wheelchairs, buggies or prams, but shopping trolleys and folding "walkers" are no problem.

The bus is also available, with a driver, for private hire at reasonable rates to Selsey groups and organisations when it is not required for the scheduled services.

The bus is owned and operated by the Selsey Shuttle Community Interest Company, and all the drivers are volunteers. If you are interested in offering your services as a driver, you are most welcome to call our co-ordinator on Selsey 605353 for an initial chat. Training and assessment will be provided at no cost, you do not need a special driving licence.

Cycling in Selsey

The flat country in and around Selsey allows for easy and pleasant cycling.

From **Medmerry Mill** there are two routes to the busy High Street. Follow Mill Lane into Crablands, then left into Paddock Lane and right into School Lane. There are cycle stands by the library at the north end of the High Street.

Alternatively, from **Crablands** turn left into West Street. Where this joins the High Street cycle parking is available at the parade of shops.

An interesting ride to the east of Selsey can include some of the blue plaques denoting local people and events, the Lifeboat Museum and some fine views. From Bonnar Road cross Hillfield Road into Seal Road, and then turn right along Grafton Road to reach Selsey Bill with its extensive coastal views. Turn round and and go back along Grafton Road, turn right to East Street, Albion Road and Kingsway. This brings you to the Lifeboat Museum. Continue along East Beach Road as far as Drift Road and Park Lane to find two of the blue plaques.

Further afield, a 7 1/2 mile route runs from Pagham Harbour Nature Reserve to Chichester. Look out for the blue and white National Cycle Network "88" signs on the left as you enter the Nature Reserve car park at Sidlesham. Follow these signs to Hunston where route 88 joins route 2 for Chichester. Turner painted a famous picture of the canal and cathedral here. Take

care when crossing the busy B2145 at this point. Also, some people choose to wheel cycles along the pavement for two hundred yards at North Mundham and walk across two small cattle grids. Otherwise the route is very quiet with long traffic free sections and superb views to the Downs and Chichester Cathedral.

From Chichester it is less than two miles to the Roman Palace at Fishbourne. Coming from the canal basin where route 88 reaches Chichester,

go over the level crossing, immediately turn left and look for the cycle route signs in the station yard.

An excellent map "Manhood Peninsular Circular Cycle Tours" has been produced by Selsey Cycle Network. This shows other superb cycle routes mostly on quiet lanes or cycle paths. The very popular Salterns Way leads to Wittering. Links to Bracklesham, Bosham or even the foot of the Downs on the Centurion Way are all shown.

Famous of Selsey

<u>Colin Pullinger</u> (1814–94): A Victorian business man who was an undertaker, wooden pump maker, repairer of umbrellas, letter writer and clerk to the Selsey Sparrow Club. He was famed for making more than two million humane and perpetual mousetraps, which were exhibited at international exhibitions in London and Philadelphia.

Edward Heron-Allen (1861–1943): Selsey's most distinguished resident in the early 20th century, Mr Heron-Allen made an enormous contribution to village life and today is still well known as the author of the classic work on local history for the area.






Eric Coates (1886–1957) the English Composer lived and worked in Selsey. He was inspired to write By the Sleepy Lagoon after overlooking the sea towards Bognor Regis. His musical composition can be heard as the theme tune to Desert Island Discs on BBC Radio 4.

Air Commodore Edward 'Teddy' Mortlock

Donaldson CB, CBE, DSO, AFC and Bar, LoM (USA) (1912–1992) who set a new world air speed record of 616 mph in September 1946, also breaking the 1,000 kilometres per hour (620 mph) barrier for the first time in the Star Meteor IV. Donaldson lived at Iron Latch Cottage and there is a blue plaque on the beach at the bottom of Park Lane to mark the event. Donaldson has a second plaque at No. 86, Grafton Road

<u>Sir Patrick Moore</u> (1923 - 2012) – astronomer, writer, researcher, radio commentator and television presenter, lived in Selsey from 1968 until his death.





born Canadian actor, writer, director and voice actor best known for his role as Dr. Rodney McKay on Stargate SG-1, Stargate Atlantis and Stargate Universe resided here for some time before he and his family later emigrated..

East Beach

Manhood Wildlife & Heritage Group

The following are four distinct green areas, all within easy reach for day visitors to Selsey or those staying longer. Down to the hard work of a few volunteers, plus support of Selsey Town Council and Chichester District Council.

East Beach Pond (situated alongside the East Beach car park opposite the sea)
A dedicated area of birdlife, wild flowers and peace and quiet, now much admired.
Awarded Gold Certificate 2012 South & South Fast in Bloom show

Selsey Common (just past the first fish market to the right of East Beach car park) Formally dominated by large bramble bushes. Now, some of this is being cleared to make it suitable for green games and paths for dog walkers.

Sensory Gardens (found at top of Manor Green Park area to rear of Selsey Centre) An area within the Manor Green Park, dedicated to the cultivation of plants, shrubs and trees renowned for their perfumed leaves or foliage.

Community Orchard (to the right of the Selsey Centre looking away from sea)An area fenced off from the main Manor Green Park, set out with 25 fruit trees.

Manor Green Park (park area surrounding Selsey Centre) A green park site suitable for children's games, with a well equipped slide and swings area. Also has a sectioned-off dog training facility.





Out & About

Fishbourne Roman Palace

Salthill Road, Fishbourne, Chichester PO19 3QR 01243 785859

The Palace was discovered by accident during the digging of a water main trench in 1960. The discovery led to nine seasons of excavations that showed the site had developed from a military base at the time of the Roman invasion in AD43 to a sumptuous Palace by the end of Chichester Planetarium the first century.

Throughout the year there are lots of exciting special events from Roman Soldiers and Theatre performances to Musical concerts and Cooking demonstrations. There are a wide range of facilities on site including café, car park and disabled access and it is easily reached by public or private transport.

Tangmere Military Aviation

Tangmere, Nr Chichester PO20 2ES 01243 775 223 www.tangmere-museum.org.uk This Museum was established in 1982 on the old RAF Tangmere airfield. From its beginnings in 1916, through its illustrious service as one of Britain's front line fighter bases during WW2 and on to its key role as home to the world speed record breaking aircraft of the High Speed Flight in the post war years it has occupied a unique place in aviation history. The museum contains countless fascinating exhibits. Here you can see priceless historic aircraft such as Neville Duke's world record breaking Hawker Hunter, actual equipment used by the brave SOE agents who were carried into occupied France on 'black Lysander' flights from Tangmere, flight simulators where you can try your hand at flying, a full sized replica of the very first Spitfire prototype and more. Much more. There is something for all the family to see and do.

Chichester Cathedral

Situated in the heart of Chichester close to the market cross.

For 900 years Chichester Cathedral has welcomed visitors through its doors worshippers, seekers, tourists, people of all faiths and none. There is an opportunity here to experience something built to give a direct experience of the divine to those who entered. For those who worship here today, it still has that power.
